LWC 1st XV is delighted to have been invited to take part in a Friday Night Lights fixture and look forward to a hard-fought, good spirited match with Shiplake College.

Rugby has been played at LWC since 1943 when a new headmaster, Mr Henderson, arrived from Gordonstoun and decreed that the oval ball game should be played, not the round ball game. Legend has it that the first posts were cut by boys from the surrounding woodland.

Since then, the game has flourished at LWC and although we are proud of our heritage and of players we have helped to produce – including Jonny Wilkinson and Ugo Monye – we are very much concerned with developing a player's enjoyment for playing the game no matter what their level.

We can put out 14 teams and play fixtures ranging from traditional derbies with PGS and Churcher's to teams further afield such as Dauntsey's and Canford. LWC enter the Daily Mail competitions and Rosslyn Park 7s tournaments at U18, U16 and U13 levels. A tour of South Africa took place in April 2012; previous tours have visited Namibia, Argentina and Australia with pre-season camps in Devon also having happened.

An experienced coaching staff is supplemented by coaching input from London Irish. LWC hosts RFU Level 1 and 2 coaching courses and



regularly hosts ELRA courses, helping to develop referees. Pupils also have the chance to attend YOA ref courses and a coaching course led by the Director of Sport.

LWC respects the values of rugby, respects the spirit of rugby and respects that there is more to be taken from the game than seeking to win. In many ways it is a game at one with the ethos of LWC.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS 2011



On Friday the 18th of November the Shiplake 1st XV marked the last home game of the school rugby season, and for many of the players the last home game of their schoolboy career, in spectacular style. 'Friday Night Lights', the brainchild of the school's Head of Rugby, Mr Sam Beckett, saw the team and indeed most of the staff and students, move camp from the boys' normal playing field at Shiplake College to Henley Rugby Club, where they would take on, under flood lights, the Merchant Taylor's 1st XV, a school of 870 boys in London.

The atmosphere on the bus was tense. There was none of the usual pre-match bravado; there wasn't even much small talk between the boys. Clearly the time for words had passed and all were thinking about how they would be defined, both individually and collectively, by their actions in the coming hours and minutes.

The boys arrived at Henley Rugby Club with plenty of time to get sorted before the 7:30pm kick off. The weather was cool and crisp, dry and clear, the boys could not have asked for better. As they walked onto the field, everyone present realised that they were all embarking on something special.

Everything appeared to be clicking during the warm up. Jack Cowmeadow was slotting drop goals and conversion kicks through the uprights, the back line looked slick and switched on and as the forwards ran through their line-outs, Ian Brown showcased a pin point accuracy that would have made Phil Taylor proud. Never out of sight though, the boys from Merchant Taylor's were also getting their game faces on. They too looked like they meant business.

At 7:30pm the whistle blew for kick off, 200 students and staff cheering in support, sat and stood side by side with parents, governors and Old Vikings of the college. Shiplake pushed their ascendancy early on and in the opening ten minutes of the game controlled the pace and tempo. Ian Brown, a talisman in the forward pack and the side's Captain scored a fantastically well worked and hard fought try under the posts, which was comfortably converted by Jack Cowmeadow. It was the fairytale start but Merchant Taylor's were not intending to go down without a fight. Suddenly things started to go wrong for Shiplake; the line-out, that had looked so perfect during the warm up, was gifting easy ball. A lack of supremacy at the breakdown allowed Merchant Taylor's turnover after turnover. Wave after wave of sustained pressure began to show chinks in the Shiplake backline defense, and poor decisions resulted in penalties, which the Merchant Taylor's outside half was only too happy to take advantage of. In the last minutes of the first half the scoreboard read 10-6 in favor of Shiplake but in the dying seconds the defense faltered once again and Merchant Taylor's crossed the line. 10 points to 11.

The half time atmosphere was one of nervous anticipation for all watching the game. It was felt by most, that the result was hanging in the balance and would be decided by the attitude and dynamism in which the teams began the second half. Heartbreakingly for the Shiplake supporters, the boys from Merchant Taylor's were the dominant force.

Two converted tries in quick succession that burst through the battered Shiplake defensive line took the score to 10-25, in favor of the visitors and looked to signal the beginning of the end for the home side. But in true Shiplake spirit, no heads went down and all battled to the finish. Despite a run of injuries and an unfortunate accidental high tackle that resulted in a red card the Shiplake team refused to roll over. Although they were not able to claw back a victory Tom Howe, had the last word when he made a fifty-metre break and sent Nick Pearce over the opposition try line. Final Score Shiplake 17, Merchant Taylor's 25.

Though the result was not what they had hoped for, the evening was everything and more and huge thanks from all staff and students at Shiplake must go to Sam Beckett for his tireless effort and enthusiasm to get this fixture up and running. It was a fantastic night and a real privilege for the boys who I'm sure will not forget it.

SOUTH AFRICA 2011





Twenty-five rugby players from Shiplake College headed to South Africa this summer for an unforgettable rugby tour. Accompanied by Mr Sam Beckett (Head of Rugby) Simon Cane-Hardy (Assistant Coach) and physiotherapist Paul Holmes (Henley Hawks and London Wasps Academy) the tour group enjoyed a mix of rugby and sightseeing as they travelled from Cape Town to Johannesburg, taking in four matches, safari and ostrich-riding along the route. In Cape Town the team stayed at the RPC, a professional training facility just outside Cape Town which is used by Super 15 teams and the British Lions. With a

superb 46-7 win against Riebeek Valley High School the rugby element of the tour got off to a flying start. After a visit to Langa Township, where the boys visited a school and gave out Henley Hawks rugby playing shirts, Shiplake College mini rugby balls, clothing, crayons and stationery it was on to Cape Point and then to Stellenbosch, one of South Africa's leading wine regions.

The tour's second match against Villersdorp High School provided another victory for Shiplake (36-17). Match three saw the Shiplake boys playing in the Glenwood House 7's tournament where they lost 36-0 in the final to the very experienced P.W. Botha College, a specialist 7s school. The College's Rugby club visit South Africa on a biennial basis but this was the first time the College had entered an overseas Sevens Tournament.

After travelling the scenic 'Garden Route' to Johannesburg the boys visited Loftus Stadium (home of the Blue Bulls Rugby Team) where they were able to meet some of the players and watch a training session.

The final match of the tour was lost to an older, more experienced side from Christian Brothers College (29-5). Playing at high altitude tested the boys' fitness levels and provided a valuable experience which helped prepare the squad for their pre-season training camp back in Henley and warm-up tournament at the Perse School, Cambridge. Final rest and recreation included a safari and an awards ceremony where Nick Arbuckle was voted Young Player of the Tour, Jimmy Wright was voted Players' Player of the Tour whilst Teddy Hewins was named as the Coaches' Player of the tour and David Plato was the Best Tourist.

TOM HOWE - ENGLAND U18





Tom Howe, who is studying for three A-Levels in Shiplake College's Upper Sixth, has been selected for England's U18 Rugby Squad. His selection comes after a successful August camp where Tom finished first amongst the aspiring young players over both the 10 metre (1.61 seconds) and 40 metres (4.83) trials. The next stage for Tom is squad training session in Leeds at the end of October. Hopefully he can put himself in the frame for selection for European U18 internationals in the Spring of 2013 followed by the possibility of playing further internationals in the Southern Hemisphere.

Tom began playing when he was just four years old but by the age of 10 he had realised that rugby union was the one passion which he wanted to pursue and excel in. Tom had his first taste of professional Rugby Union recently when Wasps selected him as a substitute for their A team game versus London Irish. With 15 minutes remaining Tom came on from the bench and soon ran in his first try at A Team level. The hours of training and conditioning that Tom undertakes in his home gym are bringing benefits.

Tom has been Shiplake College 1st XV's leading try scorer this season. Sam Beckett, his first team coach and Director of Rugby at the College, says, 'Tom has blistering pace, an ability to break-through tackles and the willingness to seek out work, whether it is running support lines or tracking back to make vital tackles. Yet those attributes alone are not enough to bring international selection. Tom is a team player, he plays for his team mates and they play for him. His passion to develop and improve is what has impressed the England U18 selectors.'


